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

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Community Orientation Program About Policing COPP

The idea behind this program is to further inform the community about the roles that the police play in the community. By taking members of the community and educating them in the various aspects of police work, will give the community a sense of involvement in the Force that is protecting the area. In giving this knowledge to the community, the community will have a greater respect for the job that the local police are doing as well as having the potential to cut down on complaints about the officers handling of a complaint.

The model for this program is the O.P.P. <u>Police and Community Together</u> (PACT) program and the City of Orlando, Florida, <u>Citizen Police Academy</u> (CPA).

The program consists of a series of lectures, one night a week for approximately 3 hours, for seven weeks. The material covers all aspects of police work and includes a ride-a-long segment. The material can be shortened or lengthened in order to accommodate local needs. In most cases, lecturers can be taken from local detachment personnel, thus cutting back on the costs of the program.
