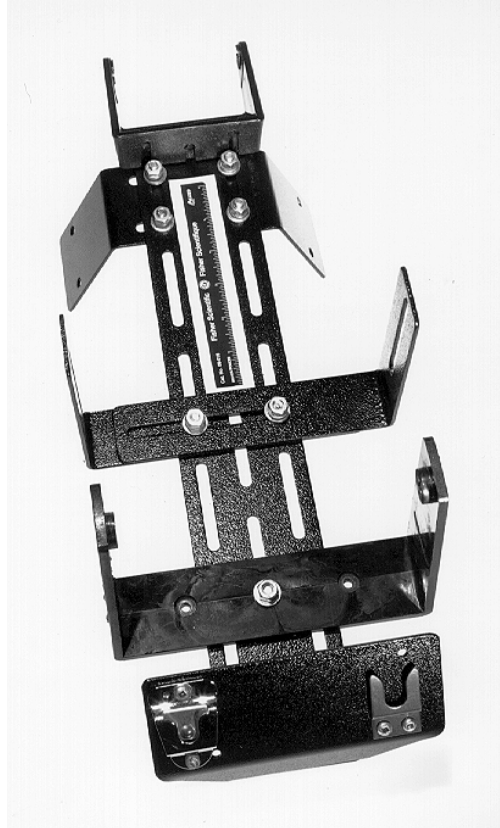

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The **Emergency Equipment Mounting Bracket** was developed by an RCMP telecommunications member in British Columbia as a lower cost alternative to commercially available brackets. It does not interfere with passenger side air bag deployment and has resulted in considerable financial savings to this Division.

The **Emergency Equipment Mounting Bracket** was developed by an RCMP telecommunications member in British Columbia as a lower cost alternative to commercially available brackets and has resulted in considerable financial savings to this Division. It is a floor-mounted unit installed between driver and passenger seats onto which various telecommunications devices and emergency equipment can be mounted. It does not interfere with passenger side air bag deployment. It was designed by Civilian Member R. G. Johnson.
