Message/Executive Summary from the Chair

The Crime Prevention Committee is co-chaired by Chief Constable Ben Andersen and Dorothy Franklin. The year 2004-05 was another productive one for the Crime Prevention Committee and its members. Funding was secured that allowed work in key areas of the work plan developed in 2002-03 to proceed systematically. As a result the French-language counterpart of the English-language learning materials on crime prevention through social development is nearing completion, and the Committee's most ambitious initiative, formation of a Coalition on Community Safety, Health and Well-being, is now under way in partnership with key national associations.

The Committee membership is stable, with vacancies filled promptly to ensure representation from all regions. The Committee welcomes the active participation from police services in Quebec, and the contribution that Quebec Committee members are making to the French-language learning materials. Attendance at Committee meetings has been high. Individual Committee members were active nationally and locally on behalf of the CACP.

In November 2005 the Committee will turn its attention to developing the work plan for future years.

The Committee acknowledges with thanks the support of the Government of Canada in the form of resource persons, and especially through the financial support from the National Crime Prevention Strategy. The Committee also thanks the CACP National Office, whose support to our Committee initiatives is instrumental in sustaining our level of activity.
