I am pleased to submit the annual report of the Traffic Committee of the Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police. Over the past twelve months we have remained committed to our strategic mission: "We accept responsibility for providing leadership in policing to improve public safety on our highways."

Throughout the year, we have strengthened our partnerships with key traffic safety stakeholders including Transport Canada, the Canada Safety Council and the Canadian Council of Motor Transport Administrators, as well as with the various partners in our Alberta based Traffic Services Pilot Project. We have continued to provide Canadian police services with contemporary risk management information relative to road safety and have also continued to provide a forum for acknowledging and sharing best practices strategies.

The Traffic Committee has continued with its four key initiatives, namely Operation Impact, the National Police Award for Traffic Safety, the Traffic Services Pilot Project and ongoing efforts to curb impaired driving. Additionally, we have responded to numerous inquiries on behalf of the CACP and have provided advice to the national office on relevant issues.
