Over the past twelve months we have remained committed to our strategic mission: *"We accept responsibility for providing leadership in policing to improve public safety on our highways."*

We continue to work closely with our key partners including Transport Canada, the Canada Safety Council and the Canadian Council of Motor Transport Administrators. We have maintained a line of communication with other CACP Committee on issues of mutual interest. The Traffic Committee has continued to provide Canadian police services with contemporary risk management information relative to public safety on our highways through Operation Impact and has provided a forum for showcasing outstanding contributions to enhancing road safety through the National Police Award for Traffic Safety and its associated Best Practices data base.

Committee members continue to represent the CACP on various external groups including the General Policy Advisory Council on the Transportation of Dangerous Goods, the National Public Safety Organization, Direction 2006 Rail Safety Committee, the Strategies to Reduce Impaired Driving Committee and the National Occupant Restraint Committee.
