### RECOMMENDATION

### CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of October 2012 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of (-7.8%) compared to October 2011, while Crimes Against Property show a (-10.4%) decrease compared to October 2011. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date reduction of (-9.8%).

### BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of October 2012. The Communications Centre statistics for September and October are included, showing total calls for service.

### DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of (-1038) reported incidents over 2011, for an overall year-to-date decrease of (-10.4%). We have seen a decrease of (-722) reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a (-15.7%) decrease. There are 124 fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a (-5.3%) decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have increased by 15 incidents for an overall increase of 1.7 % in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of (-205) fewer incidents over October 2011, for a (-7.8%) decrease. There were 25 reported Robberies in October for a year-to-date decrease of (-33) incidents or a reduction of (-11.7%).

Overall the Regina Police Service has received (-1243) fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2012 over 2011 incidents for a (-9.8%) decrease.

Total dispatched calls for service decreased by (-3.1) with a reduction in alarm calls of (-15.8).

Dear Regina Police Service,

On behalf of Carmichael Outreach's staff, volunteers and clients we would like to thank-you for your assistance and patience. My name is Danielle Goulden and I am the newly appointed Executive Director of Carmichael Outreach. Upon my appointment I identified a number of what I perceived as serious health, safety and security risks. We had a great deal of clientele participating in illegal behaviors in front, around and behind the building. It is my belief that everyone, regardless of socio-economic positions, need to understand and honor healthy boundary practices. I witnessed a number of violent altercations, severe incidences of drug and alcohol intoxication, seizures and other major health related issues due to addictions and illegal behaviors such as narcotic distribution and prostitution solicitation. As a mother of two young boys, I will be honest in saying that I was afraid to come to my job and afraid for the staff, volunteers and clients. After receiving information that single mothers were hesitant to come to Carmichael to participate in our Baby Needs Program , I decided that "cleaning up" Carmichael would be my first priority!

I began my pursuit by attempting to respectfully and courteously ask these undesirable clients to please move on and out of our area. Unfortunately after two weeks of relatively unsuccessful attempts I decided to begin calling on our sister organizations for help. I believe I called the RPS around 50 times in one week and literally every time we witnessed some of this noxious behavior. I need to clarify that Carmichael prides itself on being an inclusive and respectful environment; however, we also need our clients and community members to respect ours and other client's boundaries, health and safety. We never turn anyway away from our Food Recovery Program but with the help of the RPS we have drawn some clear and present boundaries in the Carmichael sand! After your immediate and excellent responses to our calls, my clean-up project began to truly take effect and I am happy to report that although we still deal with daily issues relating to addictions, etc. we have noticed a marked decrease in vagrancy, violence, public intoxication and illegal behavior.

It is Carmichael's hope that *everyone* who requires our assistance will feel comfortable approaching our agency. You have greatly contributed to that goal and for that we and our clients are truly thankful!

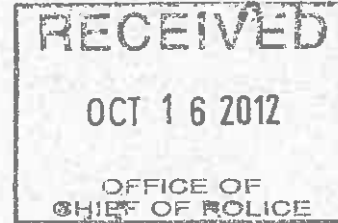
