

RECOMMENDATION

CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of May 2012 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of (-17.3%) compared to May 2011, while Crimes Against Property show a (-4.9%) decrease compared to May 2011. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date reduction of (-7.8%).

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of May 2012. The Communications Centre statistics are included showing the total calls for service.

DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of (-205) reported incidents over 2011, for an overall year-to-date decrease of (-4.9%). We have seen a decrease of (-201) reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a (-10.5%) decrease. There are 7 more reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a 0.7% increase. Over the past 14 months the Regina Police is noticing the emerging trend of an increase in reported incidents of Crime Against Property and applying crime prevention and enforcement measures where appropriate.

Thefts of Auto rates show an increase of 3.5% in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of (-216) fewer incidents over May 2011, for a (-17.3%) decrease. There were 18 reported Robberies in May for a year-to-date decrease of (-35) incidents or a reduction of (-28.7%).

Overall the Regina Police Service has received (-421) fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2012 over 2011 incidents for a (-7.8%) decrease.

Total dispatched calls for service decreased by (-3.5%); with a reduction in alarm calls of (-21.3%).






