#### CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of September 2014 reflect a year-to-date decrease in Crimes Against the Person of (-2.7%) compared to September 2013, while Crimes Against Property show a year-to-date decrease of (-4.0%) compared to September 2013. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date decrease of (-3.7%).

#### **BACKGROUND**

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of September 2014. The Communications Centre statistics are included showing the total calls for service.

#### DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of (-317) reported incidents over 2013, for an overall year-to-date decrease of (-4.0%). We have seen an increase of 10 reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a 0.3% increase. There are (-89) fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a (-4.6%) decrease year-to-date.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by (-16) incidents for an overall decrease of (-2.5%) in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of (-54) fewer incidents over September 2014 for a (-2.7%) decrease. There were 16 reported Robberies in September for a year-to-date decrease of (-16) incidents or a decrease of (-8.6%).

Overall the Regina Police Service has received a decrease of (-371) reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2014 over 2013 incidents for a (-3.7%) decrease.

There were a total of 5040 dispatched Calls for Service in September for a year-to-date reduction of (-3.8%) and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of (-7.6 %.).

Thank you for your generous support of Camp fYrefly Saskatchewan, 2014. With your help, 47 youth and young adults were offered leadership training and skills development to help them build resiliency to benefit themselves, but also so they can return to their home communities and help these sometimes contested and closeted spaces to become more open, tolerant and respectful places to live.

Camp involved more than 40 volunteers contributed 800 volunteer hours to ensure that participants were provided with the skills required to cope with the challenges that come with being a sexual minority or gender variant individual. It included an Artist-in-residence, an Elder-in-Residence, and a Playwright-in-residence who interviewed participants about experiences in their lives and what drew them to Camp fYrefly. She will be writing a play, which she hopes to present around the Province within the next couple of years, to highlight those experiences and promote tolerance and acceptance of GLBTIQ individuals, particularly in schools. Once completed, she will travel take the play around Saskatchewan. There were 26 workshop presenters who delivered 19 workshops.
