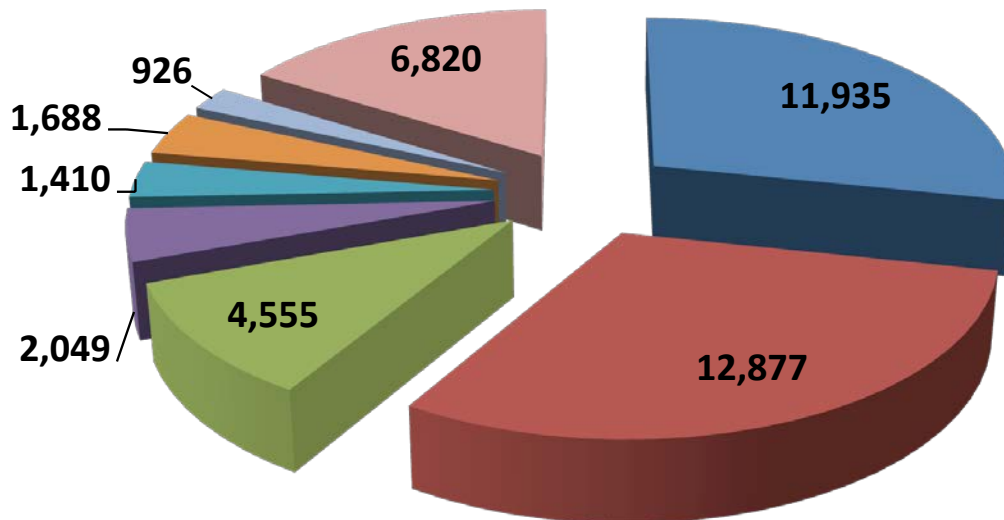

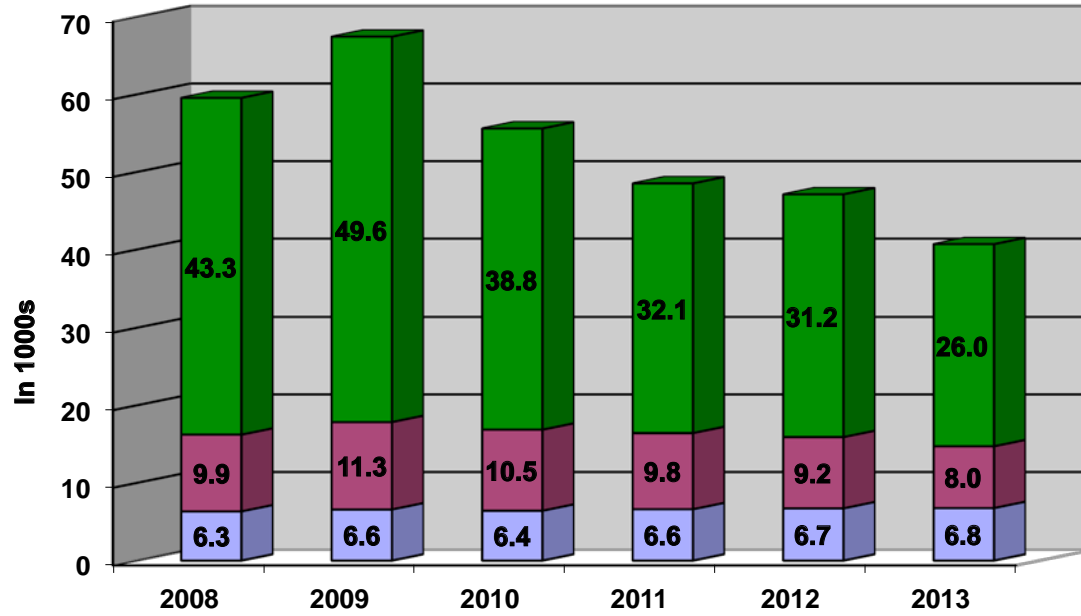

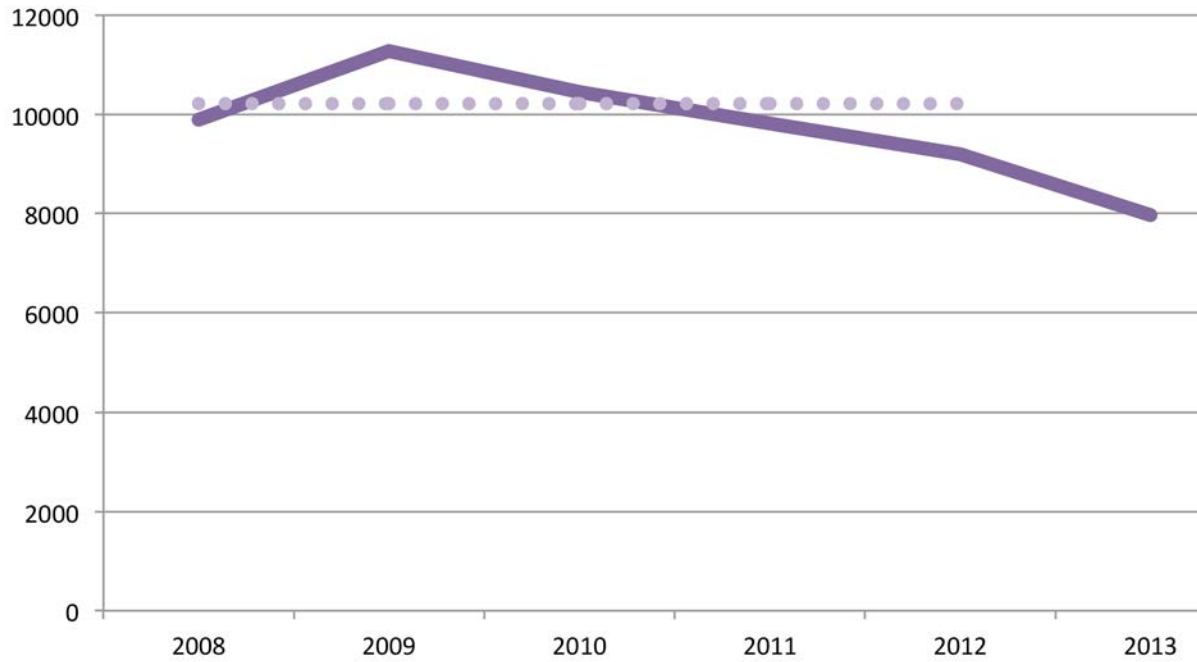

— Actual Incidents

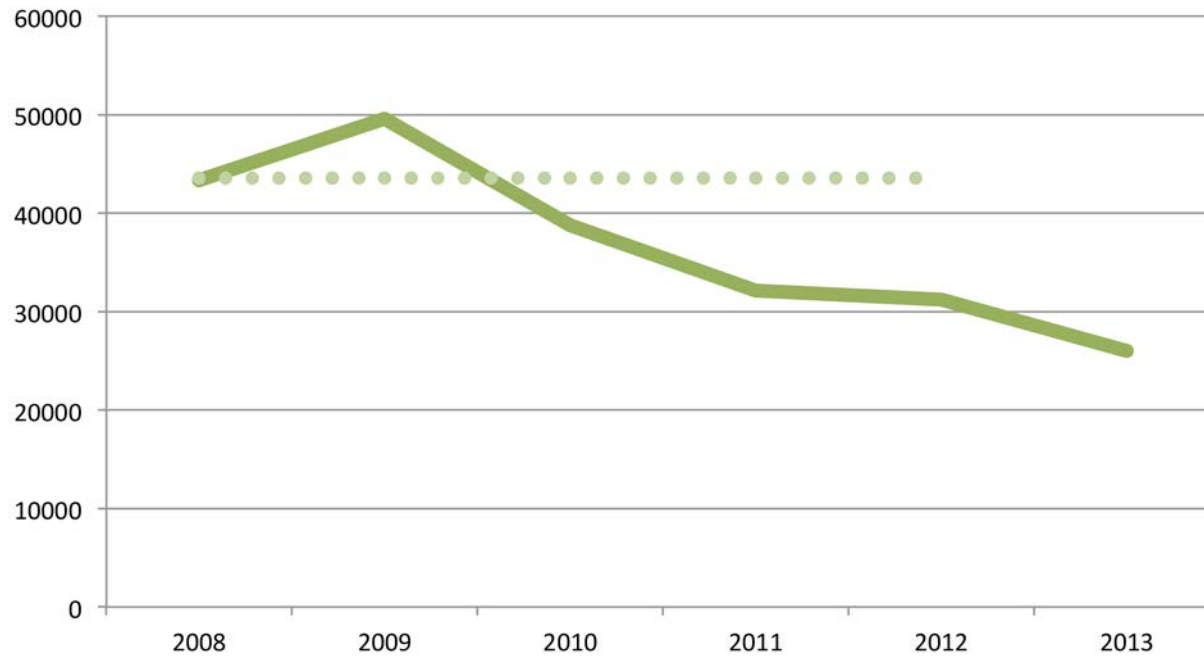

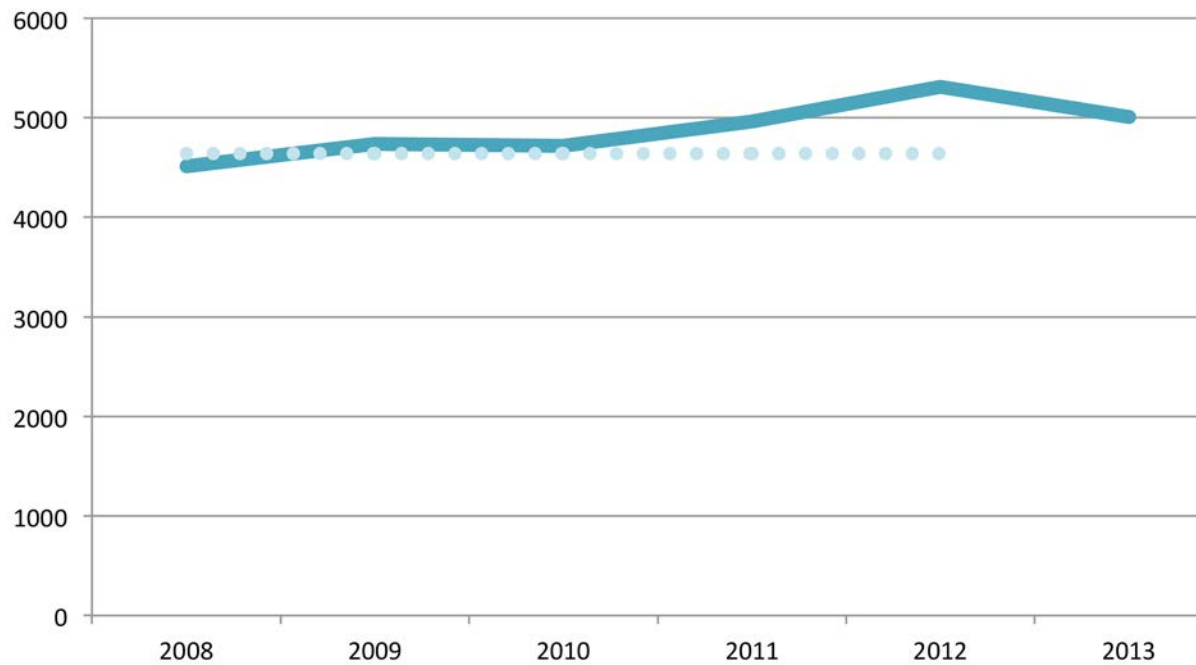

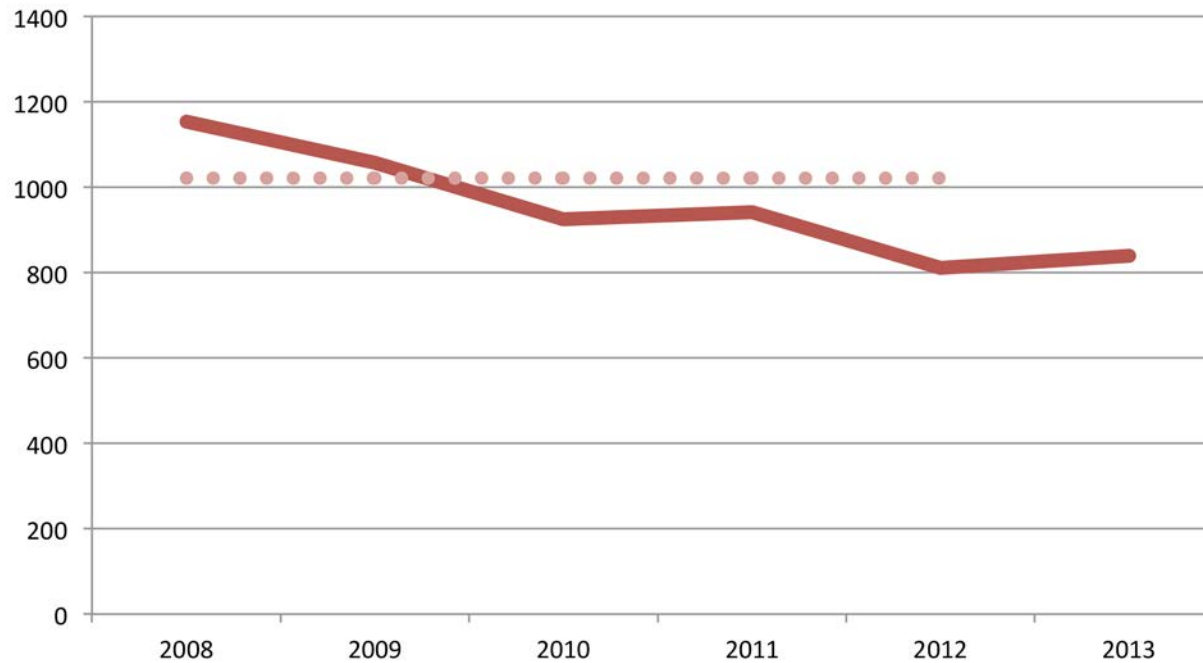

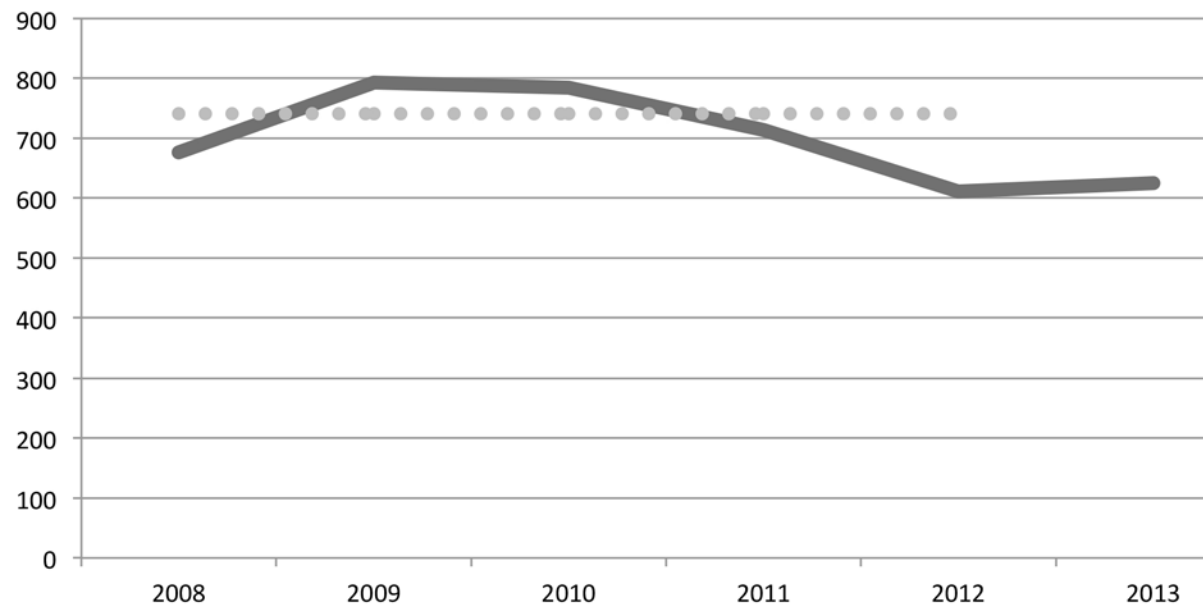
CDSA¹: 2008-2013

Criminal Code Traffic Violations¹: 2008-2013

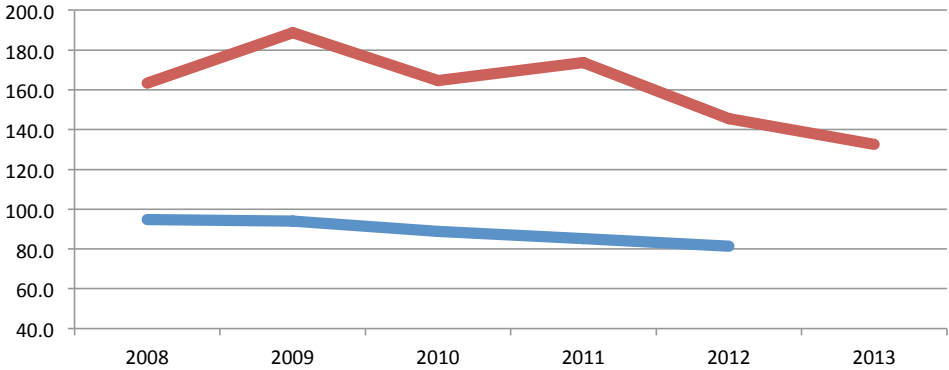

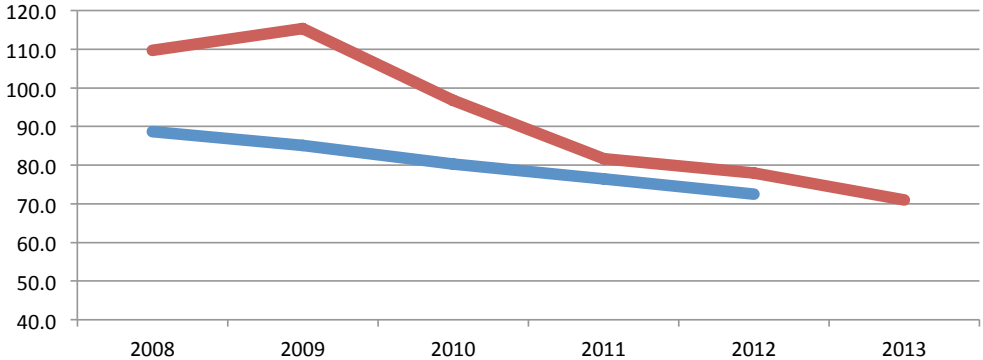
Violent Crime Severity Indices (CSI) 2008-2013

— Canada violent CSI



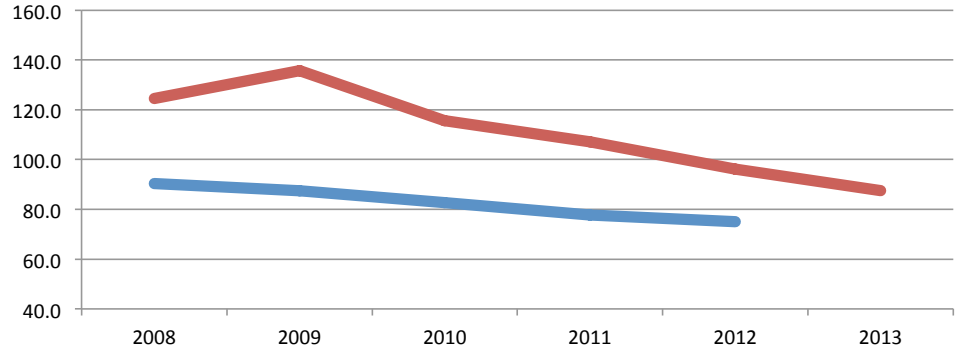
Non-Violent Crime Severity Indices (CSI) 2008-2013

— Canada Non-violent CSI



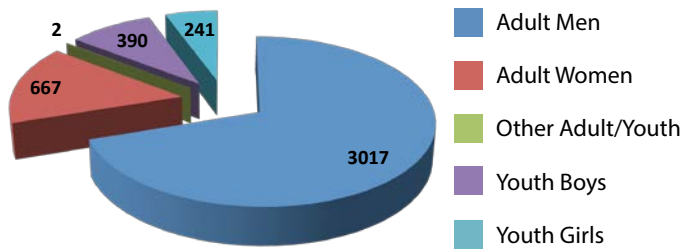
Total Crime Severity Indices (CSI) 2008-2013

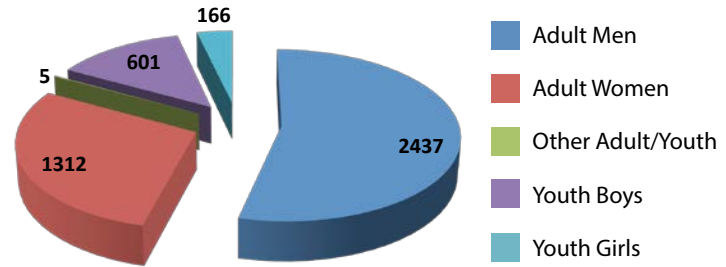

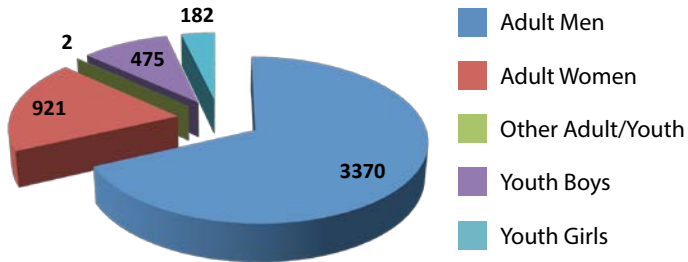
Violent Crimes - Persons Charged⁷



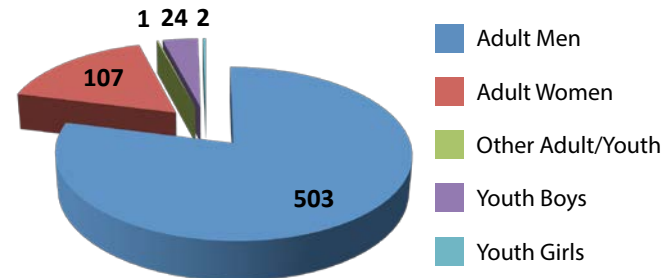
Property Crimes - Persons Charged⁷



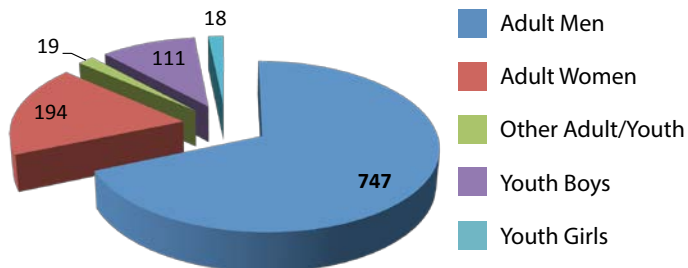
Other Criminal Code - Persons Charged⁷



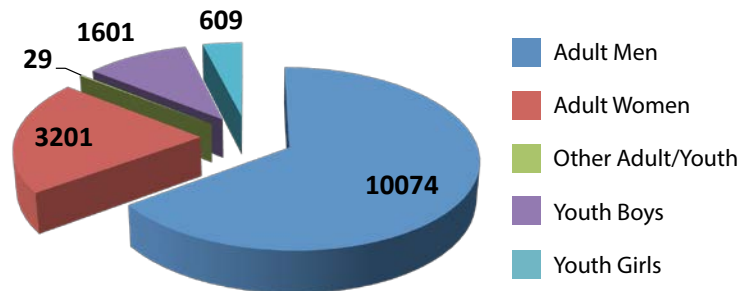
Criminal Code Traffic - Persons Charged⁷

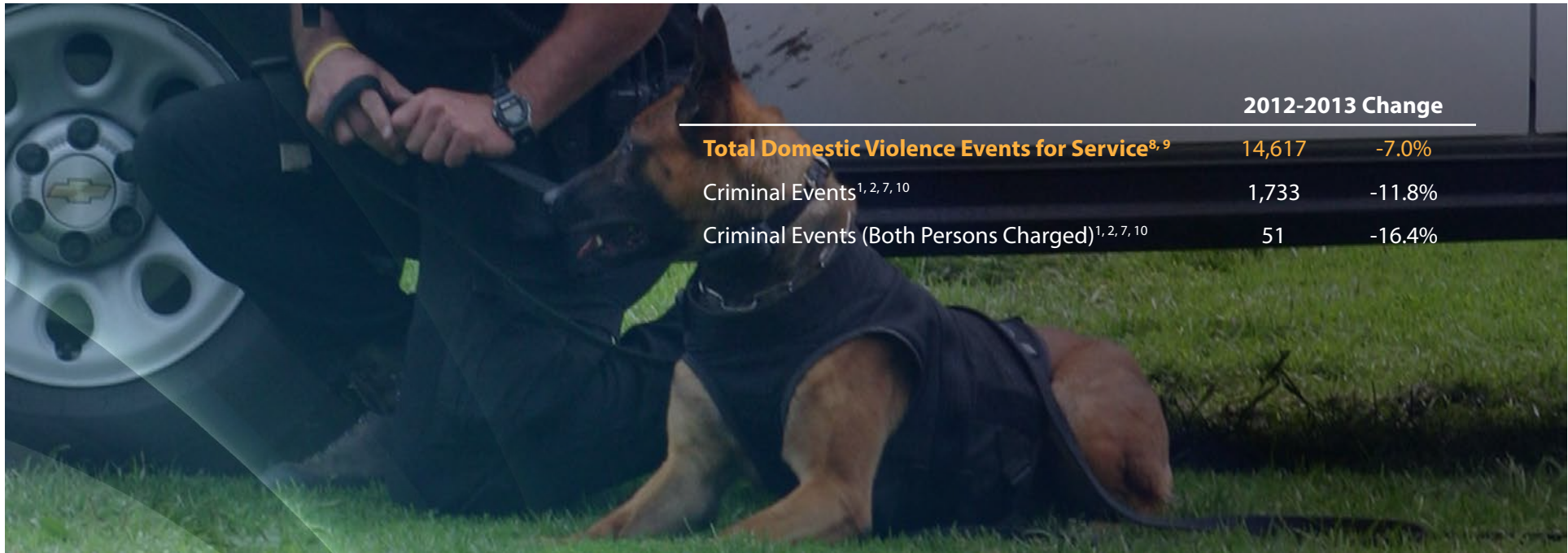


Controlled Drugs & Substances Persons Charged⁷

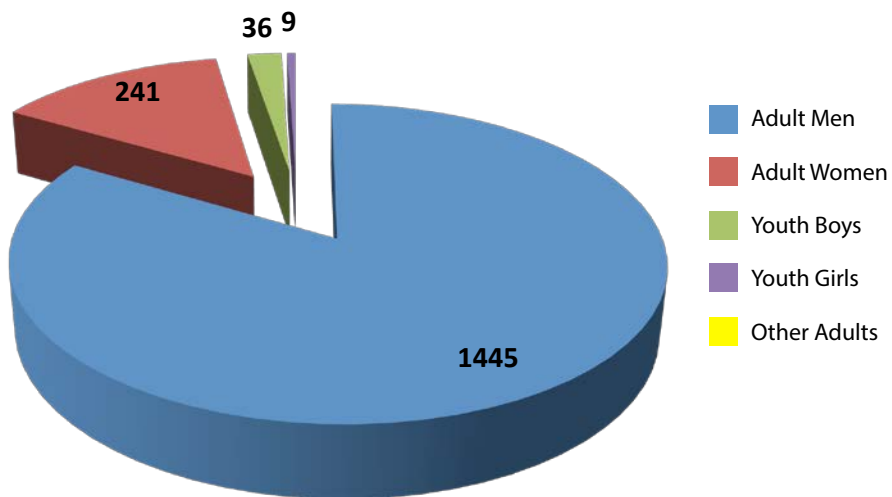

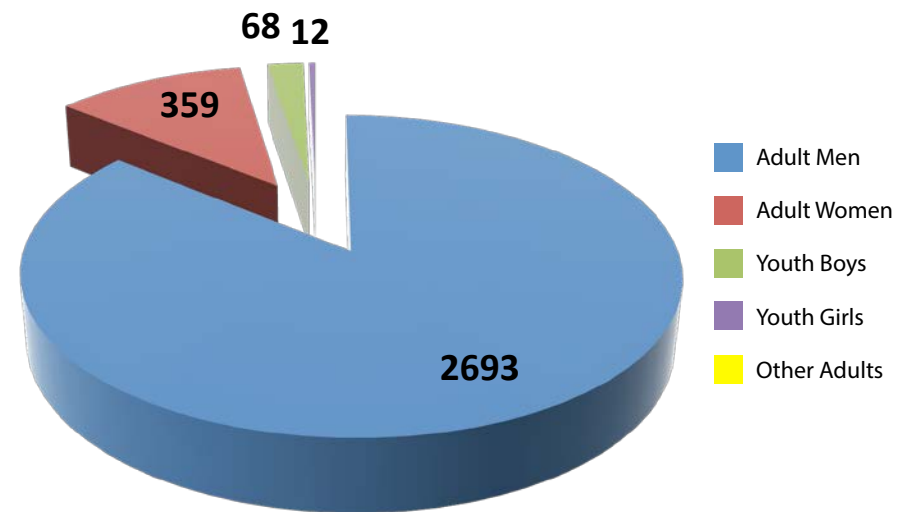




Domestic Violence - Persons Charged

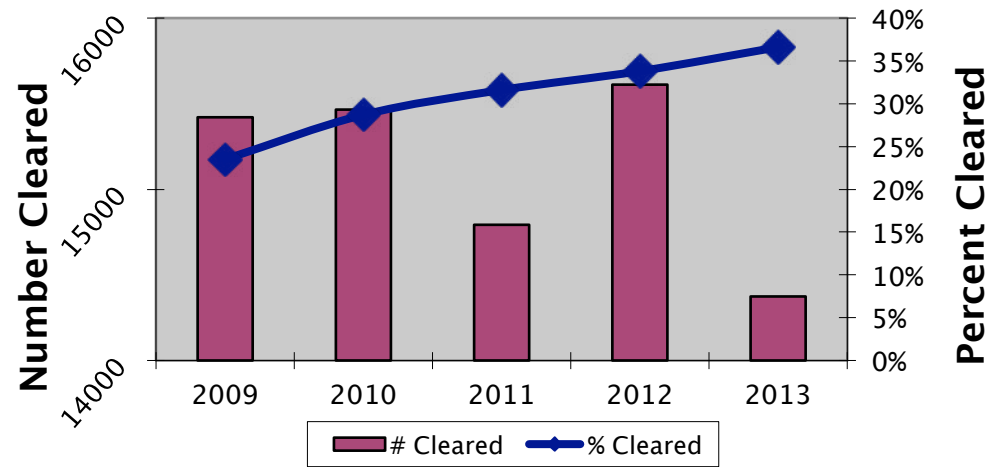


Domestic Violence - Number Charges Laid

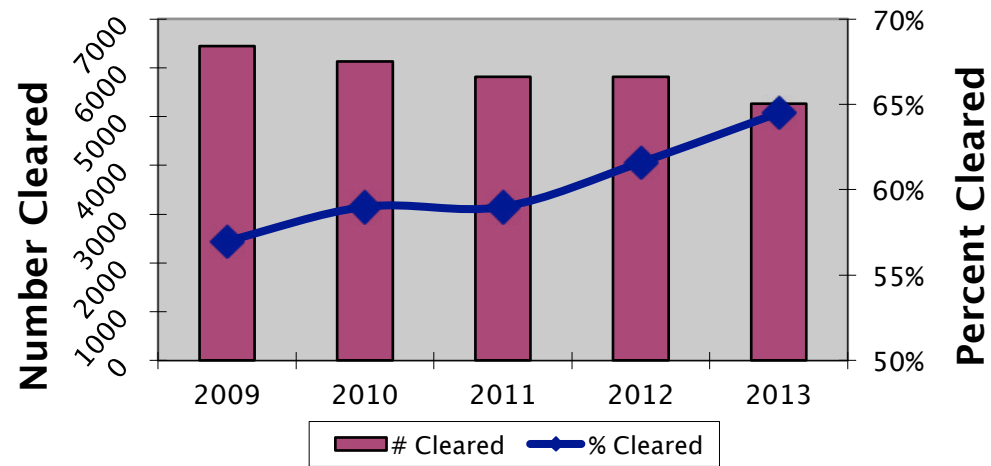

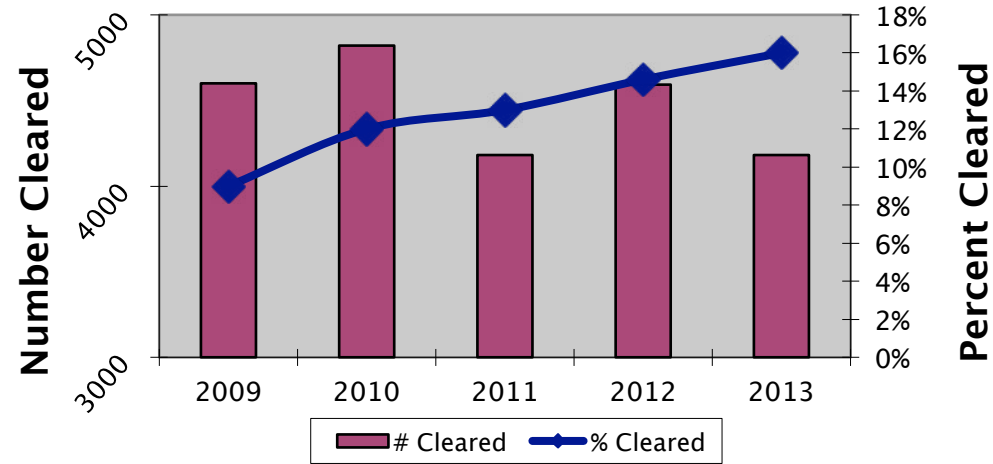

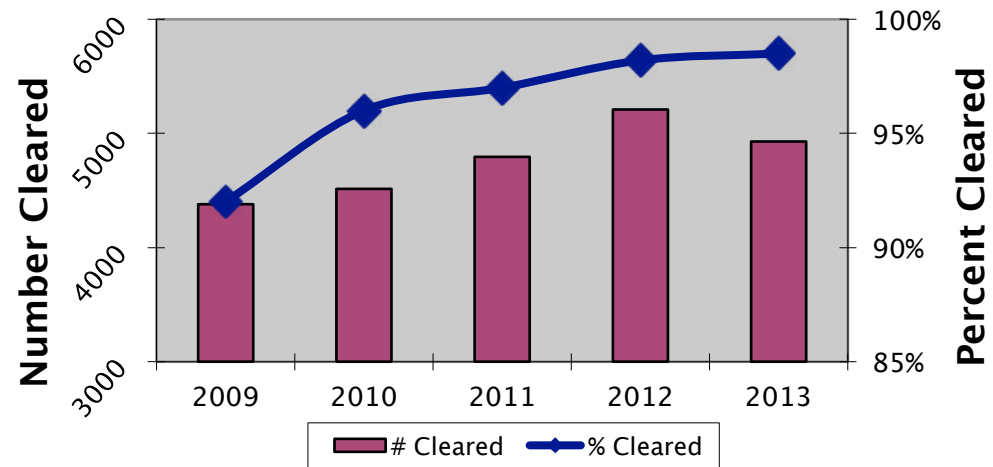
Violent Crimes¹

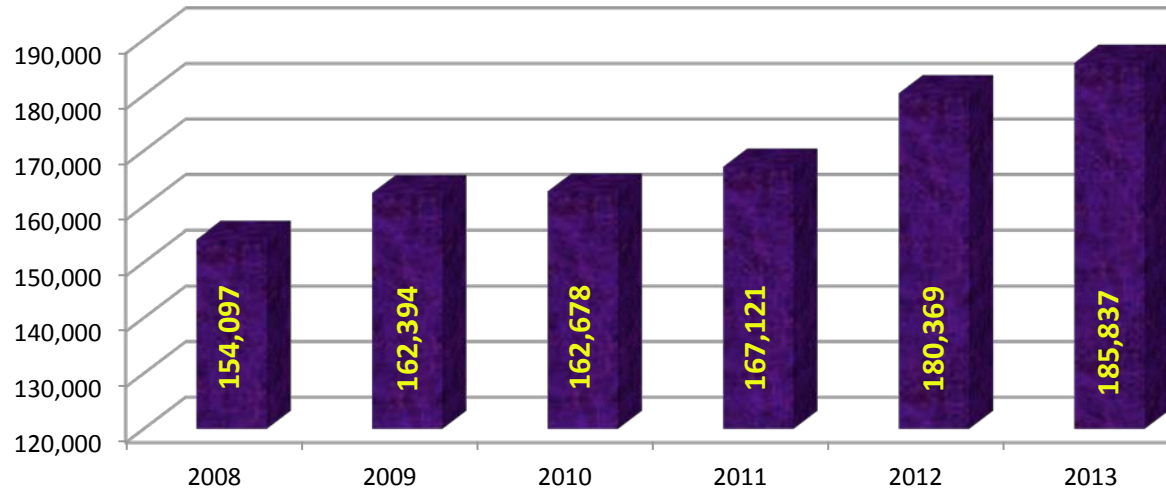

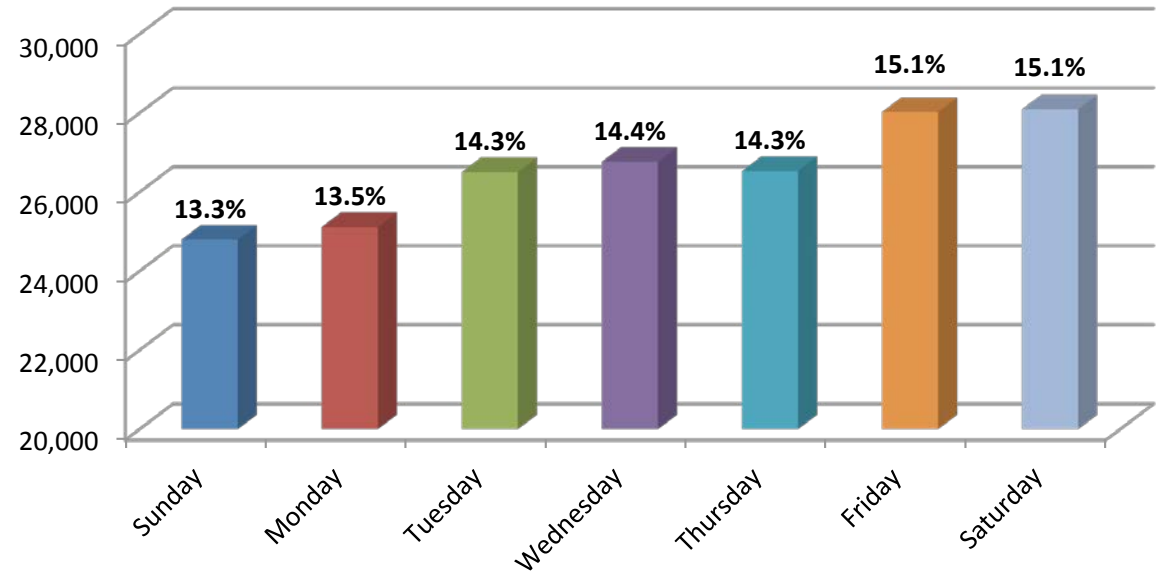

Total Calls for Service^{4,9} Dispatched & Police-initiated

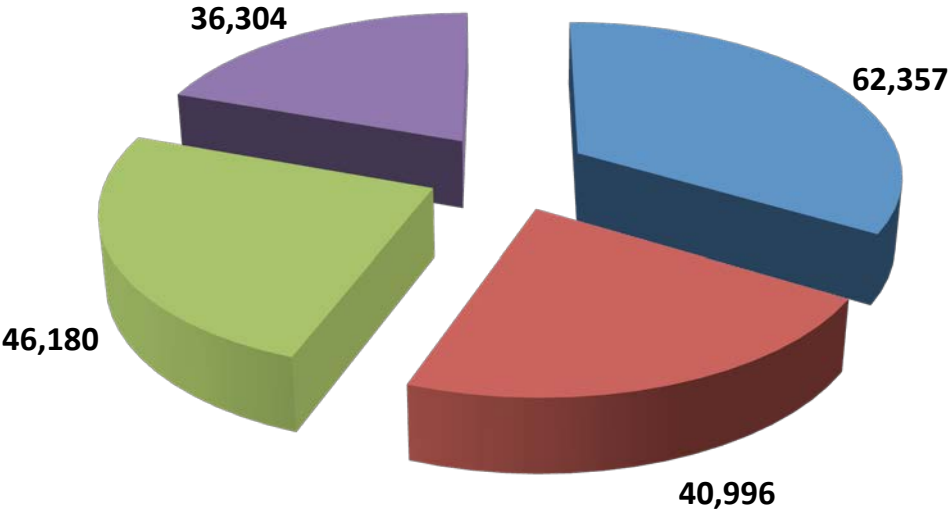


Total Calls for Service^{4,9} by Day

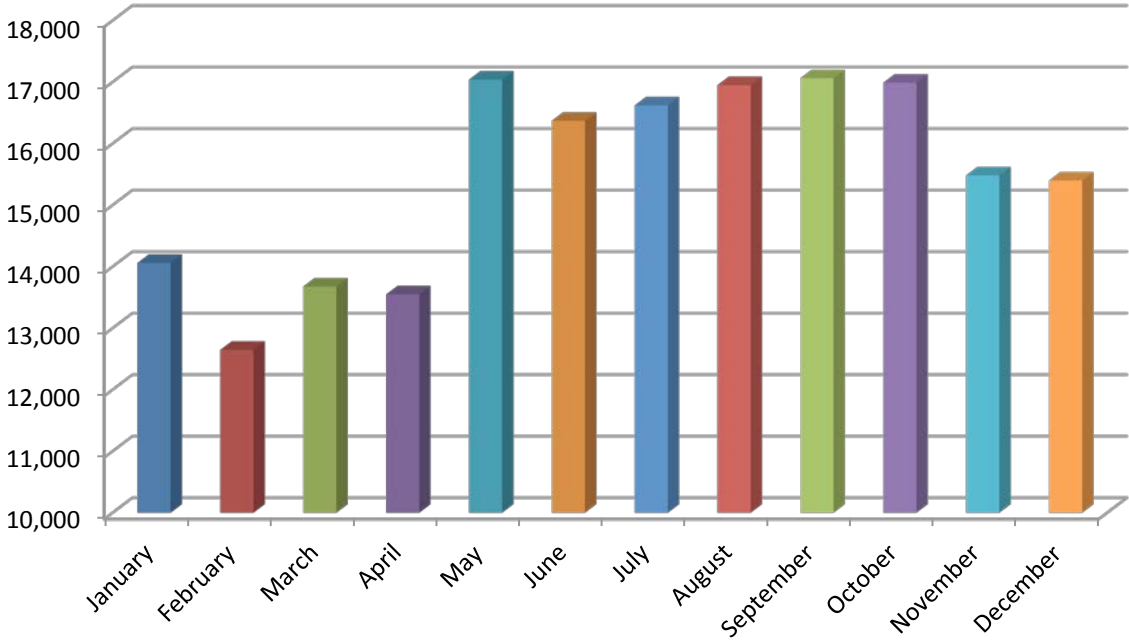


Total Calls for Service^{4,9} by District

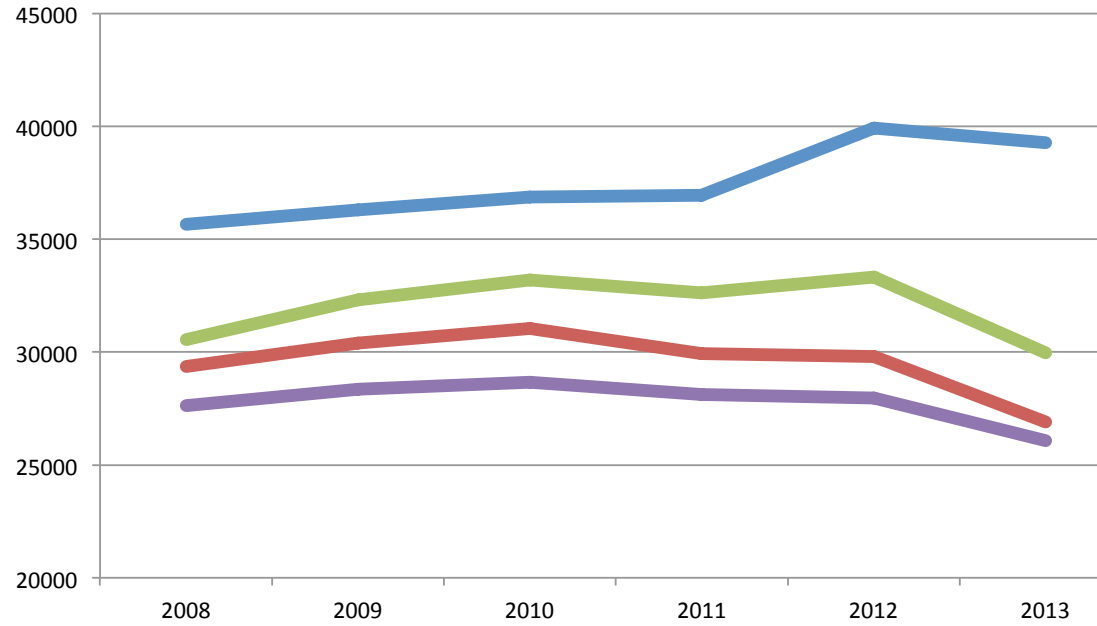
Total Calls for Service^{4,9} by Month



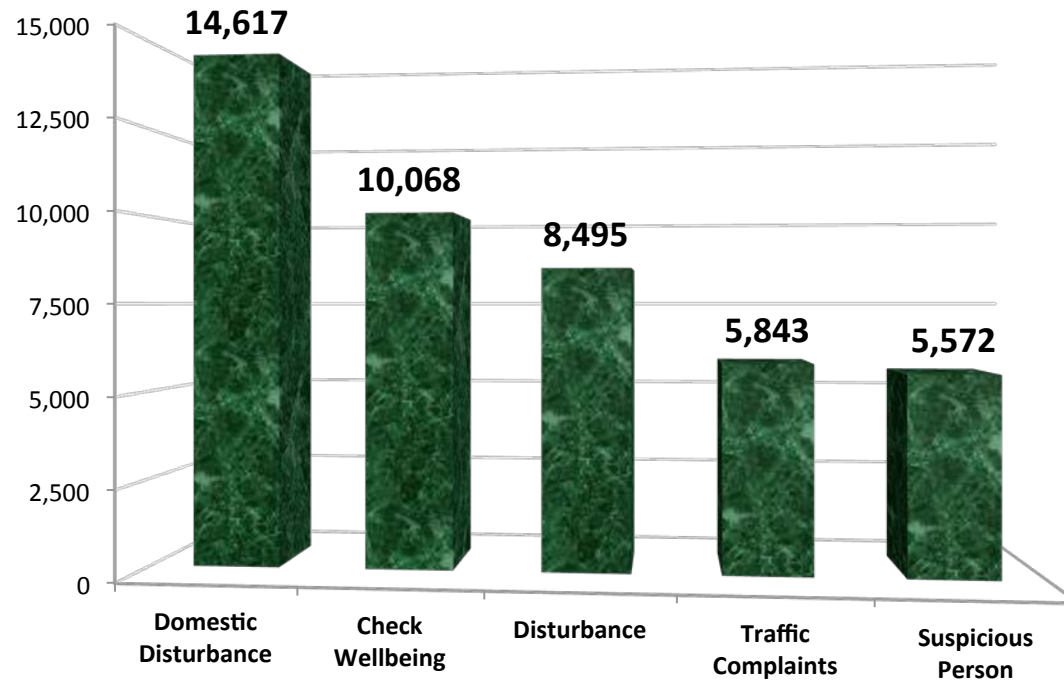

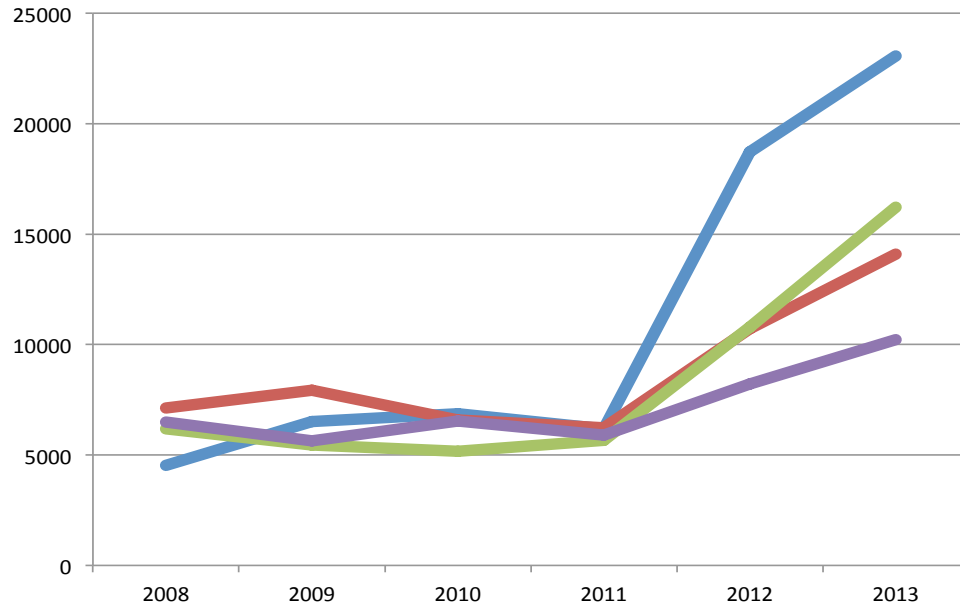




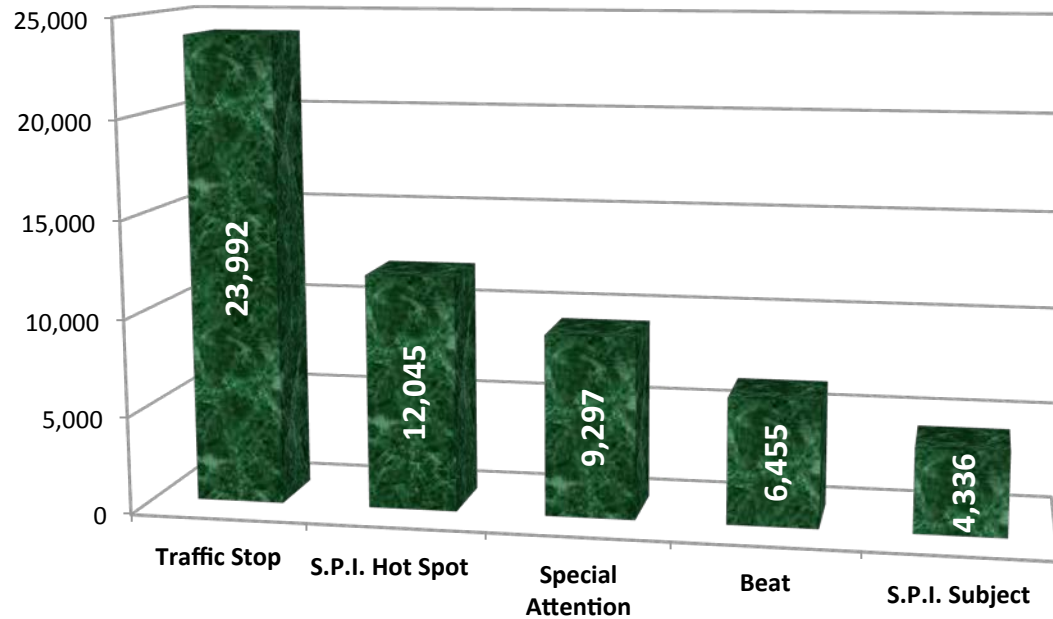

Police-initiated Events⁹ by Districts: 2008-2013

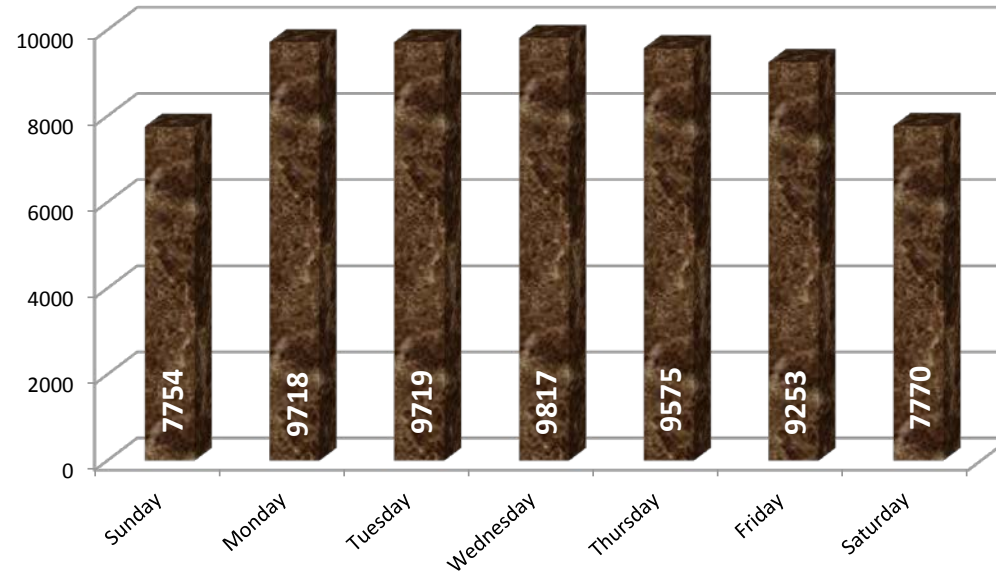

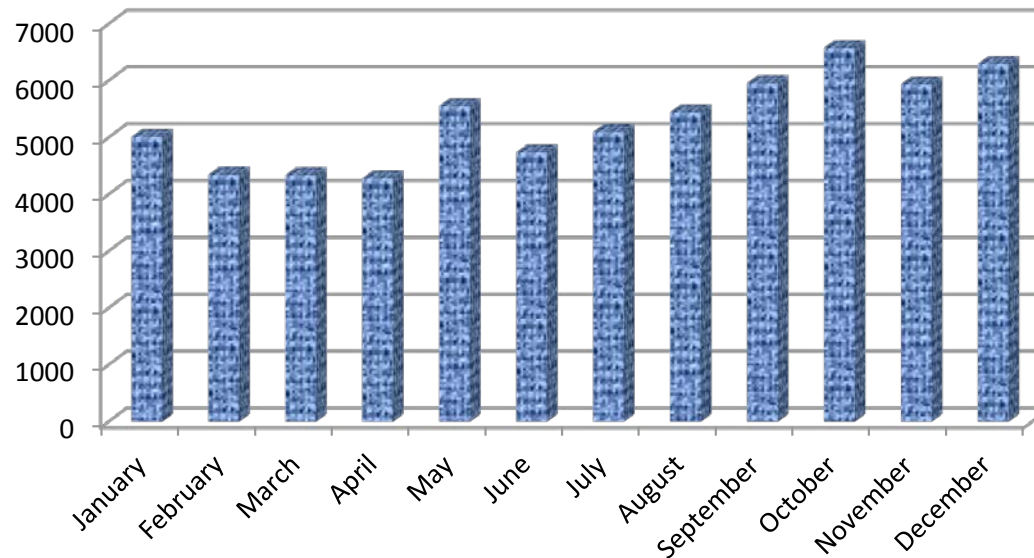
Top 5 Events – Police Initiated⁹



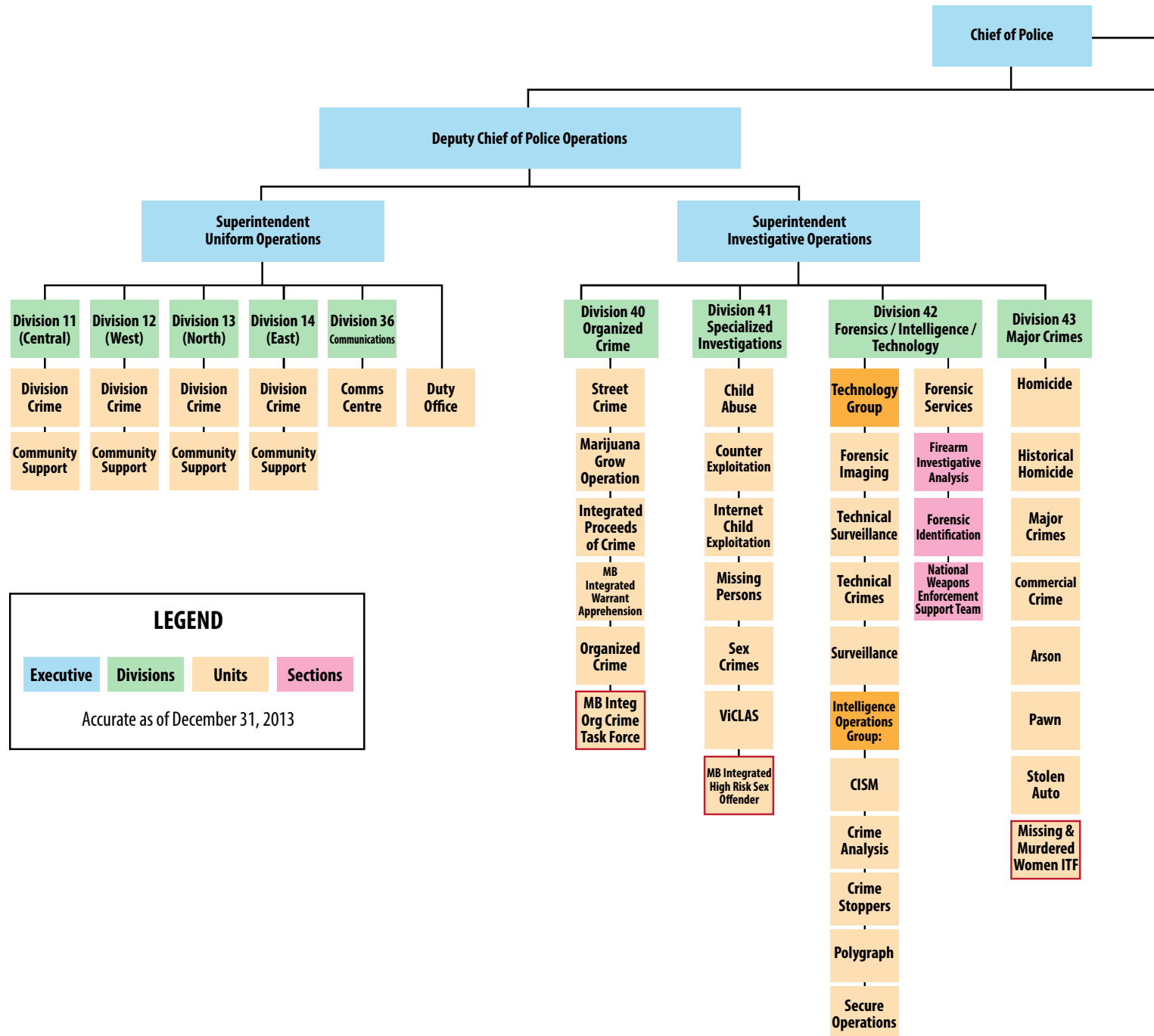
Police-initiated Events⁹
by Day



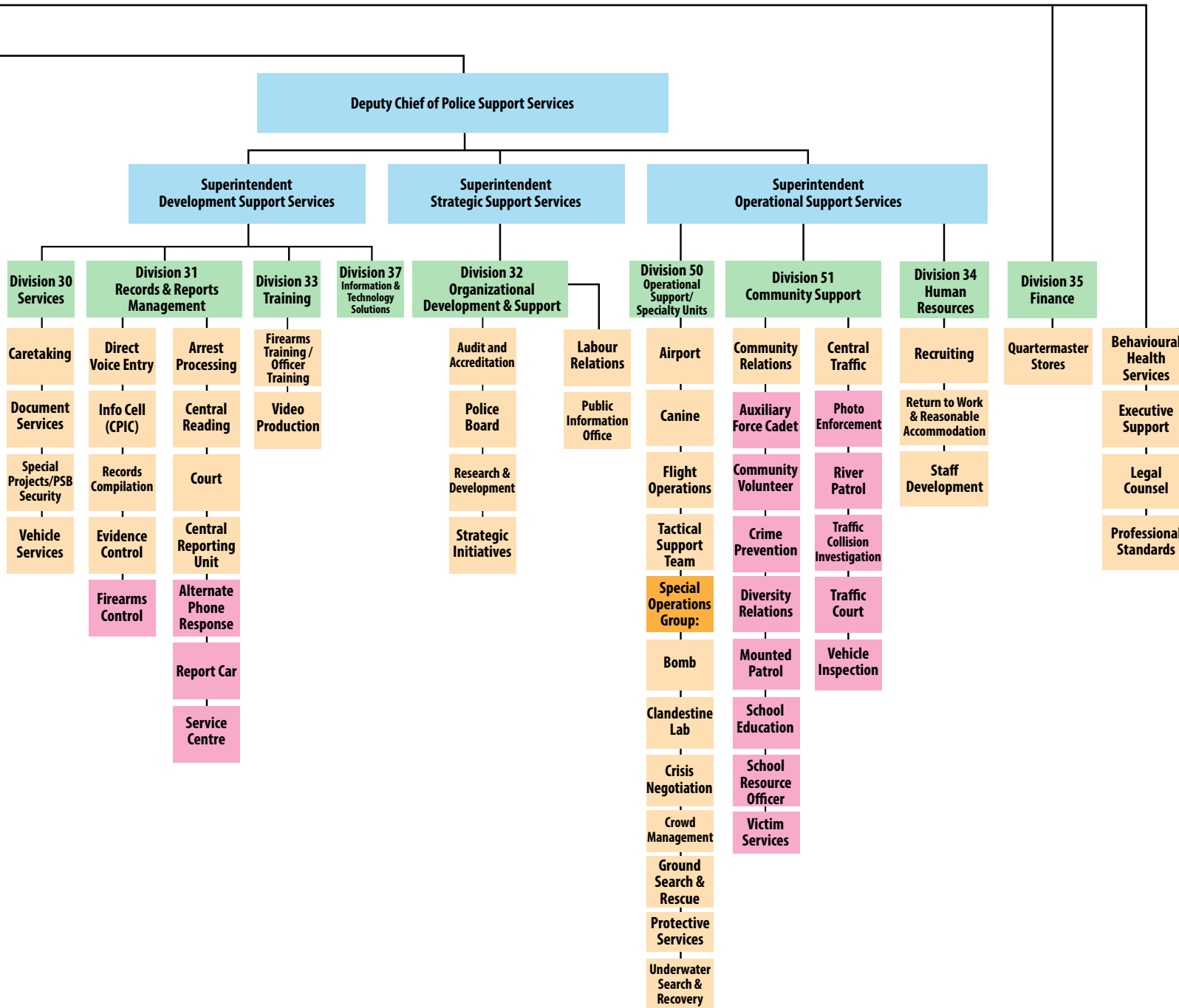
Police-initiated Events⁹

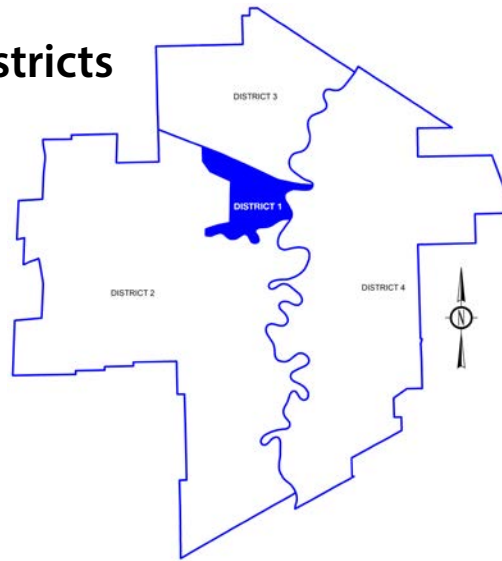

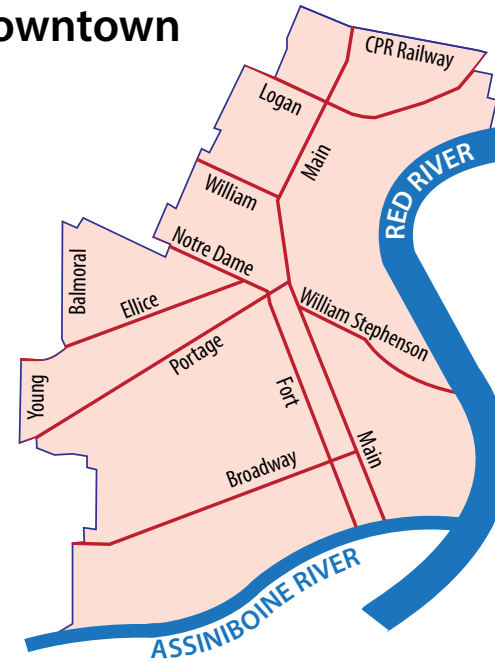

Data were compiled in accordance with violent crimes (i.e. most serious violation against the victim), property crimes, and other crimes (i.e. first violation) scoring rules.

- 3** Does not include "Arson - Disregard for Human Life," which is categorised as a violent crime.
- 4** Calls where a police unit was assigned.

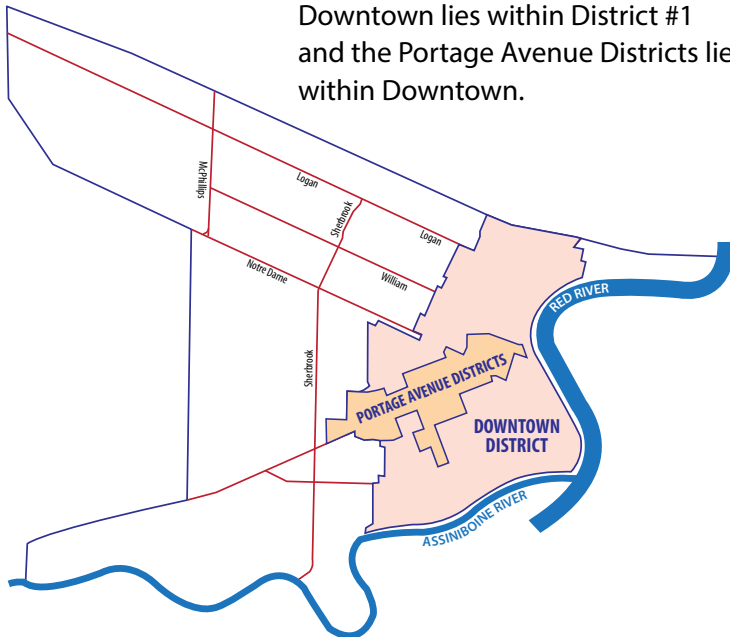

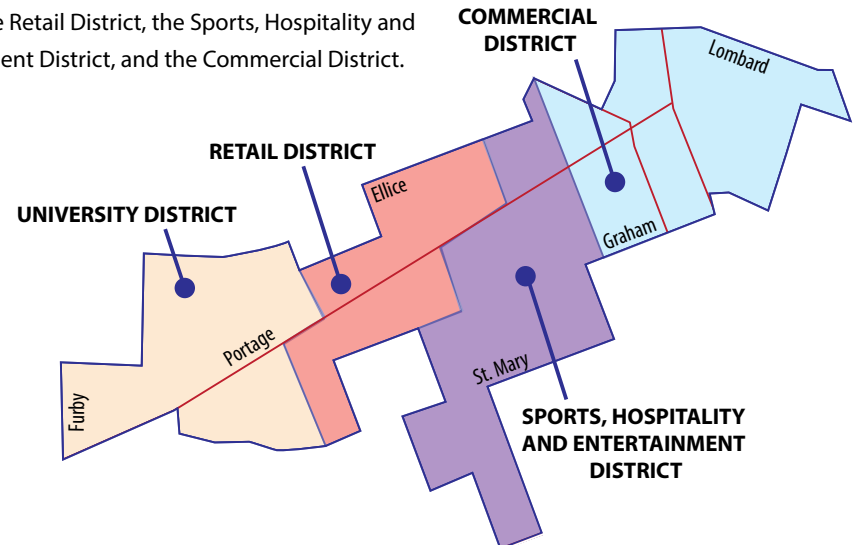
