- Policing is evolving and we must adapt to the changing environment.



1962-2013










Complexity of Crime

- Police work more complex and therefore more expensive.
- Demand for police services increasing over past ten years.
- Due to non-criminal (social disorder & MH) calls, legal complexity, technical demands.
- Put policing costs in perspective.
- Small percentage of what police do is captured in crime stats.



Child Sexual Exploitation

- Exponential growth; resource intensive.
- One case: spanning hundreds of countries; thousands of suspects; primary distribution source outside Canada; millions of dollars being exchanged.
- Volume of Data:
 - 1,250 Terabytes of data.
 - 60,000 registered users.
 - 1.4 Million compressed archives (RAR files).
 - 1.2 BILLION file transaction records (downloads).
 - 95,000 file downloads every 24 hours.
- One case = new strategy.





Child Exploitation Cases: Increasingly Complex

Performance Optimized Data Centre (POD)

Threats to Canada

- Presently 54 listed Terrorist Entities (Public Safety Canada).
- Believe all have significant presence in Ontario.
- Demonstrated and escalating lethal threats since Sept. 2014.
- Threat for isolated attacks on law enforcement and civilians exists.
- Phenomenon of radicalization poses severe challenges.





Policing Costs

- Police services in Canada: RCMP, three provincial police services (OPP, SQ, RNC), 230 independent municipal services and 38 First Nations police services.
- More than 90,000 police personnel in Canada (2013).
- Policing expenditures totalled \$13.5 billion or about \$389 per Canadian (2012).
- Between 1997 and 2010, expenditures on policing more than doubled... why?

Ontario Provincial Police: Resources



Policing Services Division (PSD) Transfer Payments Included




Percentage of Increase in Expenditures by Year







OPP Actual Expenditures and Grants as a Percentage of Total Government Actuals








What we have been measuring

- Six key public performance measures, including violent crime and collision reduction.
- Legislated annual reporting.
- Crime rates; clearance rates; number of Criminal Code incidents by officer; number of charges by officer.

Do the above measures tell us if we are being effective at reducing victimization?

Action Planning.


Focused Patrol.
