






Average Annual Growth (2002-2011)





Total Municipal Operating Expenditures (2011)








Wage Growth in the Broader Public Sector (BPS) since 2003






MUNICIPAL POLICING EXPENDITURES IN ONTARIO








Municipal Police Staffing Levels (Full Time)







rate per 100,000 population




Chart 2 Police-reported Crime Severity Indexes, 2002 to 2012



number of incidents per 100,000 population





number of victims per 100,000 population







Police strength, Canada, provinces and territories, 2012






Salary Increases across Canada

Salary hikes outpace inflation










Total Per Capita Policing Costs




